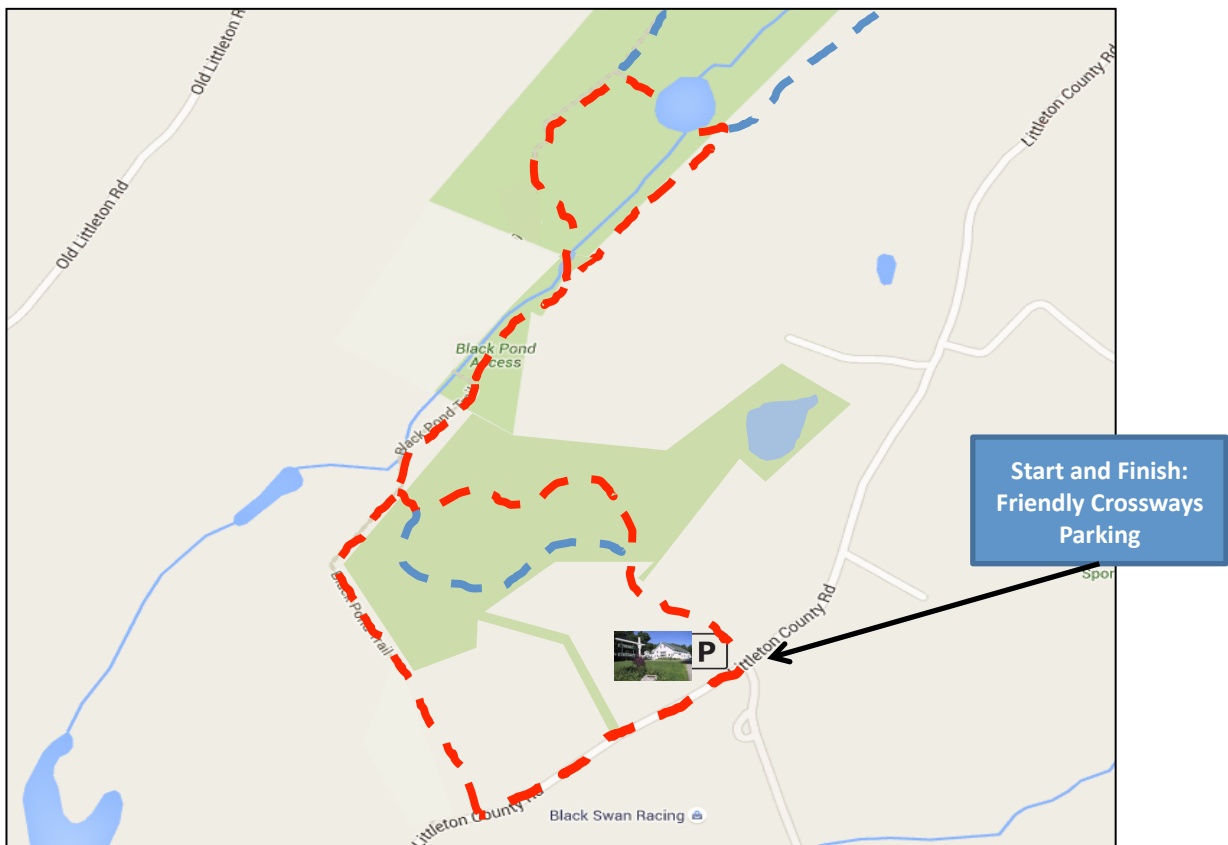


Explore a lesser known gem of Harvard's conservation land
Black Pond Walk Sunday, November 15, 2015

Harvard Conservation Commission's Land Stewardship Subcommittee is leading a hike on Sunday, Nov. 15, meeting at 1 pm at Friendly Crossways, 247 Littleton County Rd, Harvard.

Trails on 80 acres of the Black Pond and Vesenska conservation lands afford access to an even larger area of protected land on the Harvard/Littleton border that is rich with wildlife, special plant communities, unusual geology and beautiful scenery. The trail traverses woodlands dotted with glacial erratics and then follows a ridgeline and stream to a lookout over Black Pond below.

We will hike approximately 3 miles of trails to give a taste of the possibilities. Bring friends and join us to celebrate our public land and enjoy a great hike close to home. Moderate pace, but a 2 hour hike on uneven terrain with a few steep sections. Drizzle/flurries ok; rain cancels. For more information contact jamesadelson@charter.net.
